NATIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Beinecke \$32,000 to fund a terminal graduate degree in the arts, humanities or social sciences. Apply as a junior; must demonstrate financial need.

Barry M. Goldwater \$7,500 for undergraduates planning a research career in math, science or engineering. Apply as a sophomore/junior.

Harry S. Truman \$30,000 to fund graduate study in any field leading to a career in public service. Apply as a junior.

Udall Undergraduate Scholarship \$7,000 for undergraduates planning an environmental career, or Native American/Alaskan Native undergraduates planning a career in tribal policy or tribal health care. Apply as a sophomore/junior.

POST- BACCALAUREATE STUDY IN THE UK, IRELAND or CHINA

Each scholarship covers tuition, room, board and stipend. Apply as a senior or recent graduate.

Churchill Scholarship One year of study in the sciences, technology, engineering or mathematics at Cambridge University.
